

**THE ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

**THE SCOTTISH BORDERS COUNCIL**  
**(NO WAITING, VARIOUS STREETS, ST ABBS)**  
**(EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 2022**

The Scottish Borders Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to said Act and having complied with the statutory requirements of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1999, as amended hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as The Scottish Borders Council (No Waiting, Various Streets, St Abbs) (Experimental Traffic Regulation) Order 2022 and shall come into operation on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2022.
2. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable or traffic warden in uniform cause or permit any motor vehicle to wait at any time on those lengths of road specified in Schedule I to this Order.
4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any length of road referred to in this Order for so long as may be necessary:
  - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
  - (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
  - (c) to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;
5. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall apply to any disabled person's vehicle which is not causing obstruction and which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued by a local authority in exercise of its powers under Section 21(1) of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970.

6. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall apply to the driving of any mechanical road cleansing vehicle or any vehicle used for fire brigade purposes, or any ambulance or any vehicle in the service of a local police force being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
7. The Traffic Order referred to in Schedule II of this Order is hereby revoked whilst this Experimental Order is in force.
8. The Chief Executive of The Scottish Borders Council may, if it appears to her essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient, or safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area, and after such consultation and notice as are required by law, modify or suspend the operation of this Order or any provisions of it in accordance with Section 10(2) of said Act.

(No waiting at any time)

1. B6438  
Both sides  
"From a point 18m north west of its junction with the north western leg of BRIERY LAW to its termination at the root of St Abbs Pier.
  
2. Briery Law  
Both sides (North western leg)  
From its junction with B6438 46m south east  
  
Both sides (South western leg)  
From its junction with Creel Road 42m north west
  
3. Creel Road  
North side  
From its junction with Briery Law 31m north east  
  
South side  
From a point 13m south west of its junction with Murrayfield north east for 52m"
