Make a sparkly LED birthday card by sizing and cutting card, tape, and geometric shapes, and connecting the LED to a small battery. 2. Switch it up. Use a minicomputer to trigger your own fruit sound machine. 3. Robotics. Meet a beginner robot that responds when you just add numbers. 4. Music and magic numbers. Have a go at making notes and beats with everyday objects and everyday numbers. 5. Computer music. Try your hand at electronic dance music and beat making with numbers. 6. LED lights: Program a microcontroller to sequence LED lights and a teeny computer <p>Aimed at parents with children at school who are learning about STEM topics, this will provide a gentle hands-on introduction. Interested in nature and practical skills for being outside? Whether you are interested in this yourself, being out with your family or friends, or with a group, this course will equip you with the key practical skills needed.</p> <p> *Week 1: Site Health & Safety/Weather/First Aid/Natural navigation/What 3 Words/ Natural History/Nature Journaling. *Week 2: Shelters (traditional and lean too, tarps, knots) *Week 3: Fire (different fire lighting methods, tree ID, tinder, kindling, fuel wood, Kelly kettles) *Week 4: Tools (tool talks, safety, sharpening, safe usage, bowsaws, axe, bushcraft knife) *Week 5: Cordage (Spruce roots, brambles, making craft items with tools), Citizen science surveys, types of Awards. *Week 6: Cooking on a fire, making a craft item using a variety of learnt skills from the course. We have a base camp set up in the woods, with camping chairs, tea/coffee and a fire going in a fire box. If it is raining, we put up a tarp over the fire area. We do have a toilet tent to give privacy for people for no.1's. There is no facility for No.2's. We always do a check in with people at the start and end of sessions, to gauge their mood and where they want to take their learning. </p> <p>Training will be delivered by two Directors of Instinctively Wild CIC, supported by volunteers. Instinctively Wild CIC run Eco-therapy and Forest Schools for a wide variety of organisations. The skills taught on the course are what we use all the time to deliver our sessions.</p>
