- I believe this is an important asset for the town and should definitely be preserved.
- I strongly support the application for the old East Station Office to be transferred to the ownership of Peebles Community Trust. This group is well run and has the best interests of the town at heart. They would be best placed to raise the necessary funds and to implement the refurbishment and long term management of this last remaining building from a bygone era in Peebles.
- Preserving the buildings which were key to the daily working lives of the people of Peebles is really important for future generations. The story of how the railways played a vital part in the chain of transporting goods, livestock, people in and out of Peebles was key to the town's development. It's also incredibly interesting. Sadly, the railway office is all that remains. I feel we have a moral obligation to look after this building and in doing so recognise and remember the people involved when railway transport was active in Peebles.
- I fully support the transfer of the 'old weighbridge office in East Station car park' into the ownership of the Peebles Community Trust so that:
  - it can be preserved as a historical asset for future generations
  - it can be adequately restored and refurbished
  - it can become a community asset for public use
- I think this building sitting in such a public and accessible place with its link to historic Peebles and its former railway days has become almost iconic. As SBC have limited resources for such projects it is unlikely they will invest resources into the building therefore I believe community ownership is the only viable option.

I have faith that their enthusiasm for this building makes them the best overseers of it. 91 I really don't see what the problem is in handing over an original railway building to a group of enthusiast who wants to renovate and preserve part the towns history. Why does it take so long to give it the green go ahead, anybody would they wanted to open a nightclub....... 92 I wish to express my support for the transfer of the former Peebles East Station weighbridge office into the ownership of Peebles Community Trust, under the terms of the Community Empowerment Act, in order that it can be restored to heritage standards. This building is the only remain link to the railway history of Peebles being a classic example of a North British Railway goods yard weighbridge office and dates back to the latter part of the 19th century.

- The East Station Office, Peebles Asset Transfer Request should be granted. This historic building, an important example of Peebles railway heritage, is well worth preserving. Adjacent to the main car park and Sainsburys, the building is in an excellent position to provide further service to the community and town. Large enough, but not too big, the structure, following further renovation, should attract considerable interest and multiple possibilities of use.

SBC have done nothing with this building the entire time I've been alive, they should give it away for free to the genuine enthusiasts that will make this building an amazing attraction within Peebles before it falls into complete I fully support this Asset Transfer request. It is really important that this building is restored and saved for present and future generations. It is 117 the one remaining railway building left in Peebles and if it was to deteriorate more and be demolished, we would have very little to remind us of the important role the railways played in the development of Peebles. The transfer of ownership to the PCT will provide a number of opportunities for funding restoration of this building and I like the plans described in the asset transfer document. The applicants are under no illusion of the amount of work needed, but I believe its future would be a lot more secure under community ownership rather than the current 118 I come from the area and still visit my family regularly. There are some suggestions for potential use (e.g. cafe, hairdresser) which are practical ideas given the space and the need to provide income. Im pleased to see there is no suggestion of a museum or heritage centre. Working in the sector, we see too many people open venues with good intentions but no experience of interpreting or caring for collections, no experience of audience development and no understanding that heritage is simply not profit-making. I do however feel there should be a professional interpretation panel to engage the community and visitors in the buildings past.
