## Q4 Community Action Team Report

The following is commentary based on the statistical information provided in the CAT Quarterly Impact Report for quarter 4 (January 24 – March 24) of 2023/24.

- The number of parking tickets issued across the Borders increased considerably in quarter 3, with 389 tickets issued for the quarter. This increased to 399 in quarter 4. A total of 1033 tickets were issued in 2023/24.
- 28 youth warning letters were issued in quarter 4 resulting from proactive patrols and engagement with young people in Peebles, Innerleithen and Kelso.
- There was a notable drugs seizure in quarter 4 in Galashiels where the CAT worked alongside the proactive crime team.

 SBCAT found a group of youths on the roof of a commercial building in Kelso and they were conveyed home to their parents.

#### **EVIDENCE OF IMPACT**

SBCAT assisted the proactive crime team in the execution of numerous search warrants in Galashiels that resulted in the seizure of approximately £2.5m worth of cannabis.

#### **EVIDENCE OF IMPACT**

 Several young people were found to be committing antisocial behaviour. Licensed premises checks were carried out and several traffic tickets were issued and warnings were given to drivers.


