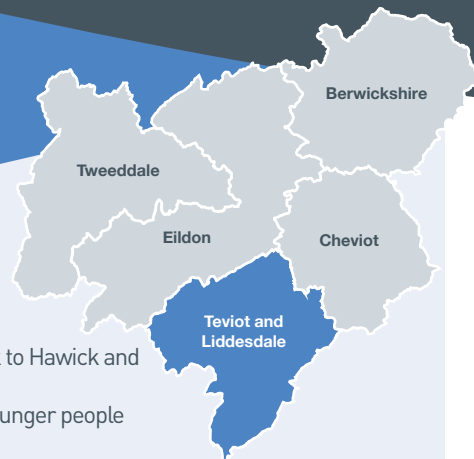

POPULATION ESTIMATES AND PROJECTIONS

National Records of Scotland (NRS) estimates the population of **Teviot** to be

17,806 population
(15.67% of the Scottish Borders (SB))

15.9% aged 0-15
(SB = 16.6%; SCOT = 17.0%)

59.3% aged 16-64
(SB = 59.9%; SCOT = 64.7%)

24.9% aged 65+
(SB = 23.5%; SCOT = 18.3%)

22.0% of people live in a rural area compared to (Scottish Borders = 47.4%) and (Scotland = 17.7%) (SCOT)

The NRS projects that the population of **Teviot** will **decrease by 5%** between 2015 and 2026.

There is variation by age group:

-5% all ages
(SB = 1%; SCOT = 4%)

2% aged 0-15
(SB = 0%; SCOT = +6%)

-15% aged 16-64
(SB = -8%; SCOT = -1%)

+13% aged 65+
(SB = 25%; SCOT = 22%)

On average **13.8%** of people are **income deprived** compared to 9.7% for the Scottish Borders and 12.5% for Scotland, however within Teviot there are areas where **27.0%** are income deprived.

6.3% people aged 60+ claiming **pension credits** compared to 4.5% for the Scottish Borders and 6.2% for Scotland.

(SB = 76.5%; SCOT = 69.9%)

85.7% P7 pupils with "no obvious dental decay"
(SB = 82.8%; SCOT = 67.9%)

8.2% P1 pupils classified as "obese"

HEALTH

Higher rate of **hospitalisations for coronary heart disease** compared to the Scottish Borders and Scotland.

More early deaths from coronary heart disease compared to the Scottish Borders but less compared to Scotland.

More emergency admissions compared to the Scottish Borders and Scotland.

Higher rate of multiple emergency hospitalisations for patients (65+) compared to the Scottish Borders and Scotland.

'Rubbish and litter lying around', 'people using or dealing drugs', 'people being drunk or rowdy in public places' and 'vandalism or graffiti to property or vehicles' a more common neighbourhood problem in **Teviot** compared to the Scottish Borders

14% of the people in **Teviot** live within the 10% most **Access Deprived** in all of Scotland
(SB = 27%)

15.0% report **public transport** as an **accessibility issue**
(SB = 16.6%)

Fewer road traffic accident casualties compared to Scottish Borders but more compared to Scotland.

27.5% people had **witnessed or experienced antisocial behaviour**
(SB = 20.8%)

40.6% report using **local bus service**
(SB = 42.5%)

17.0% say there are **areas** where **they feel unsafe**
(SB = 12.5%)
