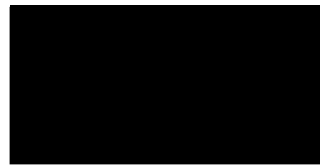

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979  
AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under Section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument known as Kelso Abbey, dated 19 January 1979 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Roxburgh on 6 March 1979 is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument as being bounded to the south by the River Tweed, to the West by Bridge Street, to the north by the church yard of Kelso Old Parish Church and to the east by Glebe Lane. Principal exclusions to the scheduling are all post-monastic structures above the ground which are not in the care of [REDACTED] and all plots of ground where burial rights exist. The area measures a maximum of 300m N-S by 220m as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

Scheduled area 

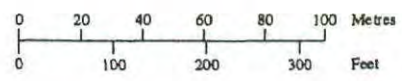
Kelso Abbey
