Digital Exclusion Index

The Digital Exclusion Index, Weighting Option 4, is a combination of the following indicators which are ranked and scored at Datazone Level. Several of the indicators are given double-weighting, reflecting their importance as a determinant of digital exclusion:

1. Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation 2016 vigintile
2. Percentage of children in low-income families, 2014
3. Average percentage of households that do not receive 2M bit/s broadband (double weighting)
4. Percentage of people aged 16-74 who have never worked or are long-term unemployed, 2011 Census (double weighting)
5. Percentage of households in Social Rented sector, 2011 Census
6. Percentage of people aged 16 plus with no or elementary qualifications, 2011 Census
7. Percentage of people aged 65 plus with no or elementary qualifications, 2011 Census (double weighting)
8. Percentage of the population aged 75 plus, 2015 (double weighting)

The following datazones are within the 20% most Digitally-E-excluded:

- Kelso: Poynder Park, High Croft / Orchard Park
- Hawick: Commercial Road, Crumhaugh, all parts of Burnfoot, Silverbuthal, Wellogate
